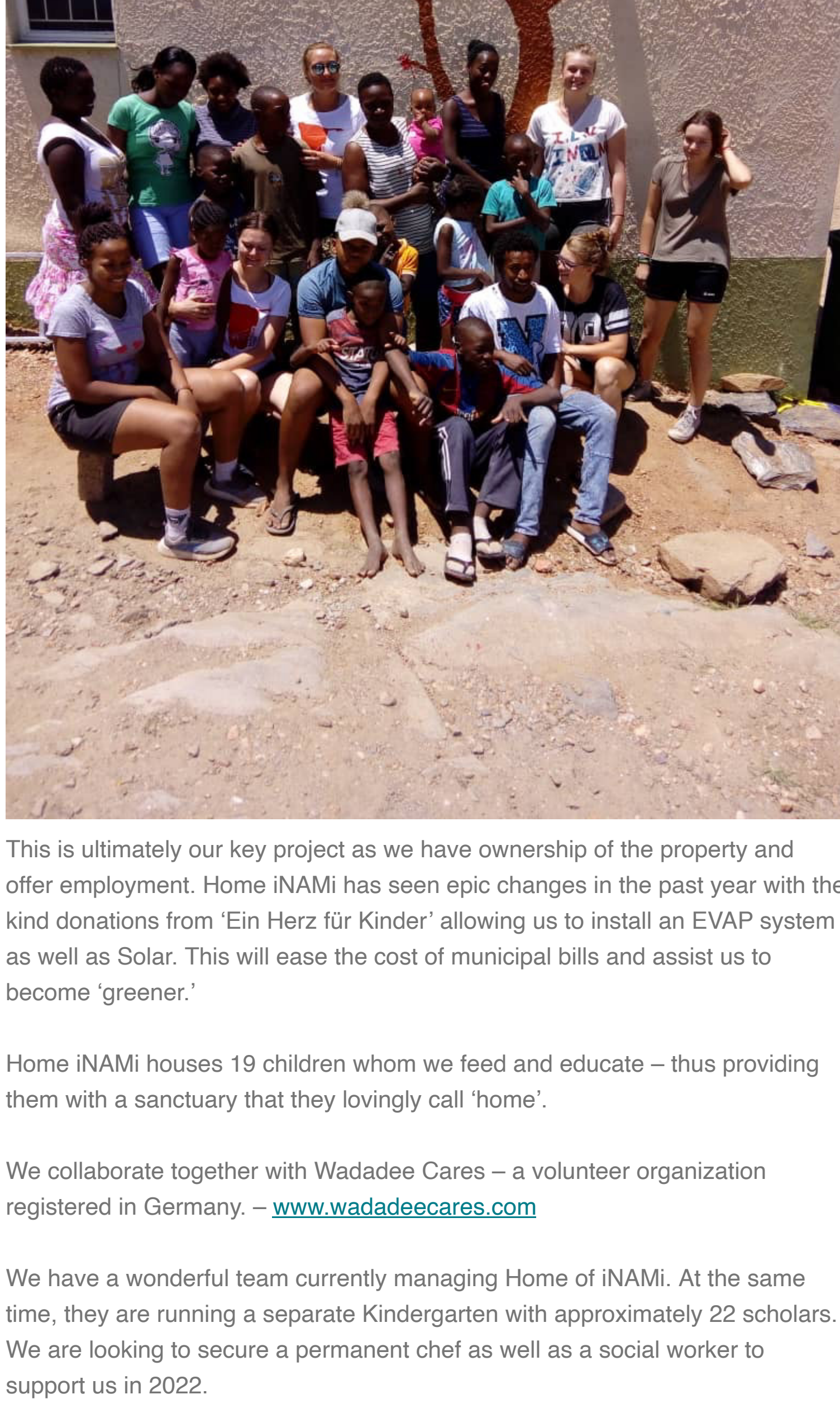

Project - Home iNAMI



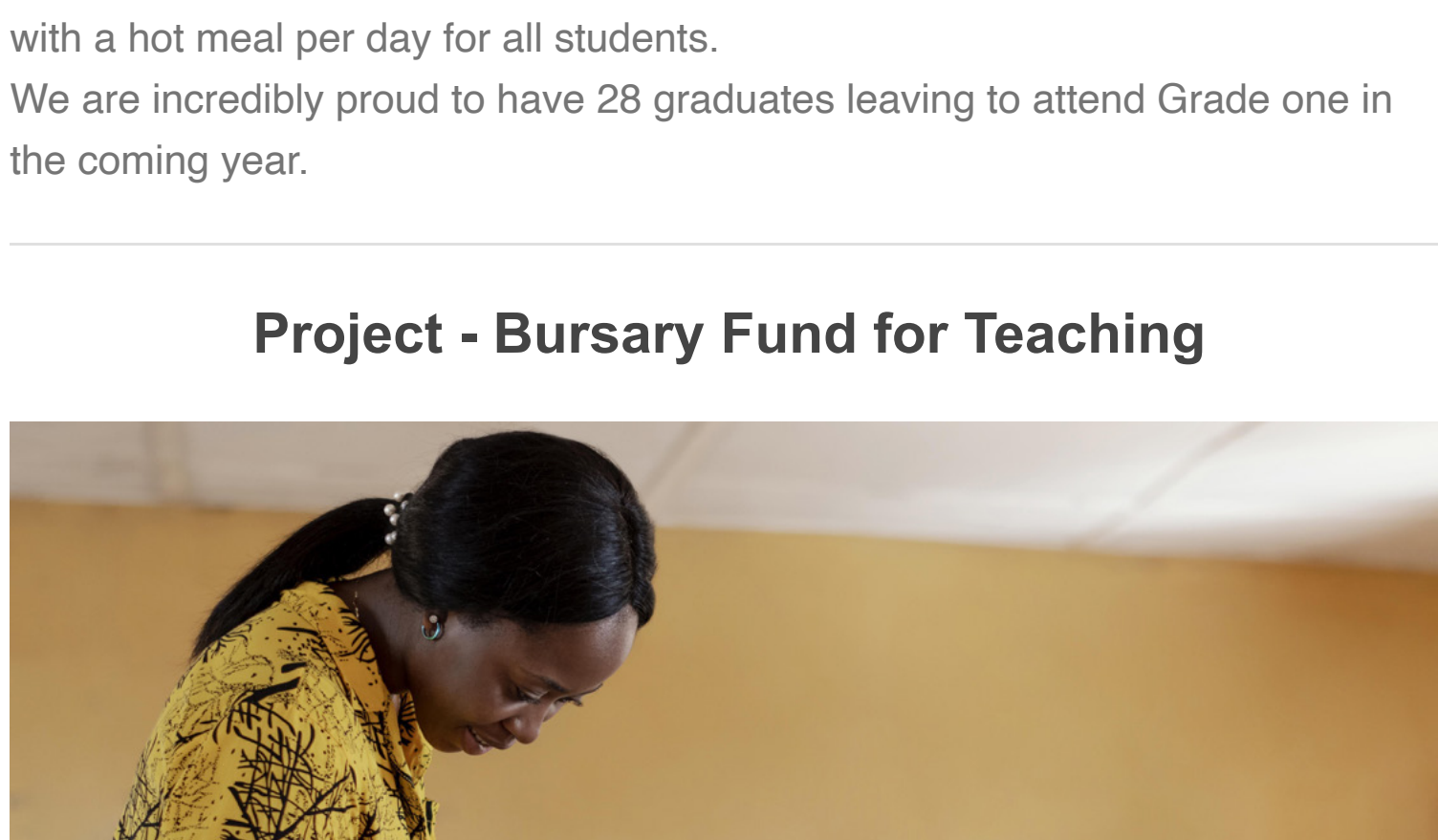
This is ultimately our key project as we have ownership of the property and offer employment. Home iNAMI has seen epic changes in the past year with the kind donations from 'Ein Herz für Kinder' allowing us to install an EVAP system as well as Solar. This will ease the cost of municipal bills and assist us to become 'greener.'

Home iNAMI houses 19 children whom we feed and educate – thus providing them with a sanctuary that they lovingly call 'home'.

We have a wonderful team currently managing Home of iNAMI. At the same time, they are running a separate Kindergarten with approximately 22 scholars. We are looking to secure a permanent chef as well as a social worker to support us in 2022.

Project - Villa Colourful



Villa Colourful is our delightful kindergarten, with principle Laurentia at the helm of this quaint local school. We have supported Laurentia throughout the year with a hot meal per day for all students.

We are incredibly proud to have 28 graduates leaving to attend Grade one in the coming year.

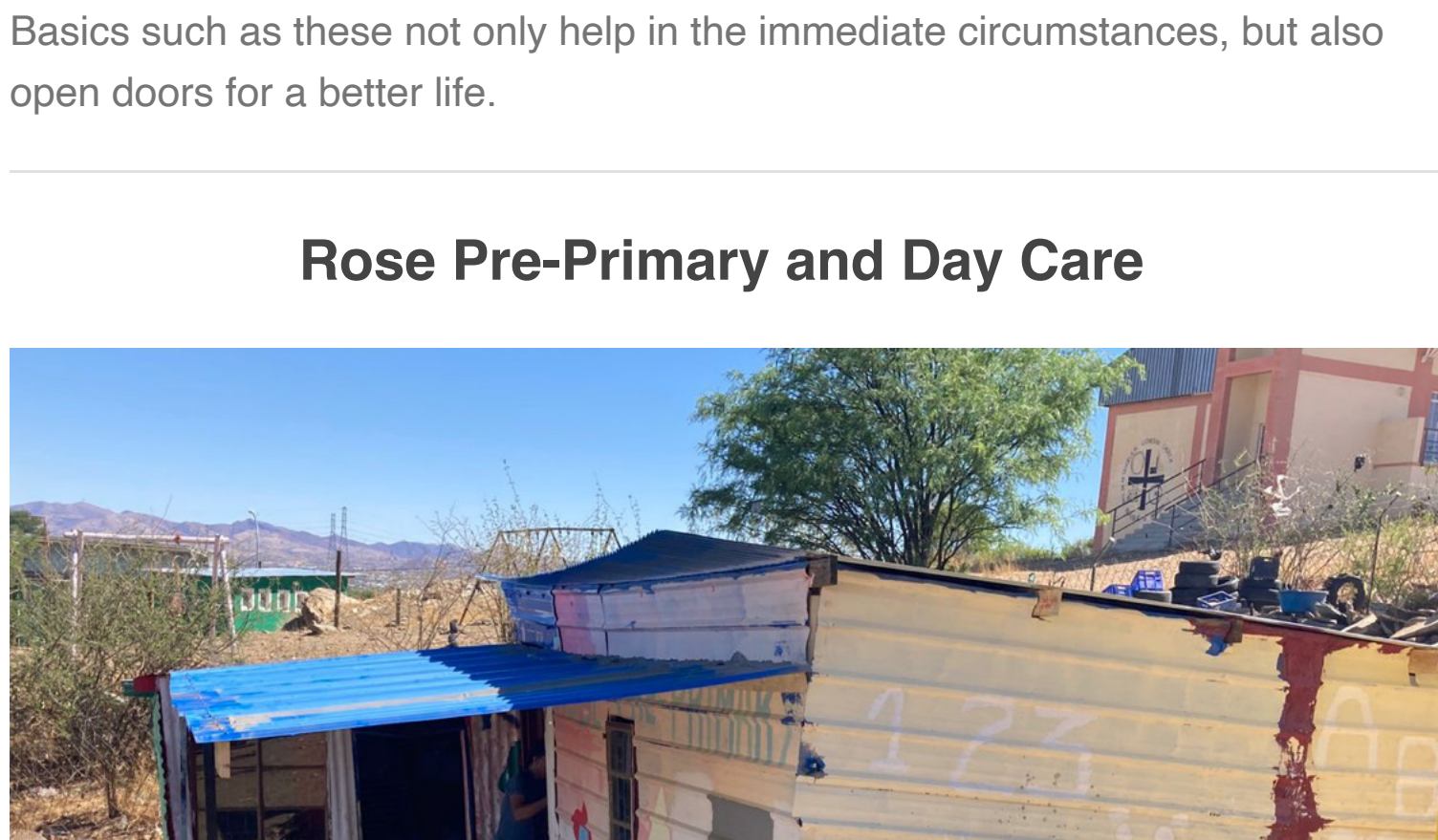
Project - Bursary Fund for Teaching

Project - Anita (Okahandja Community)

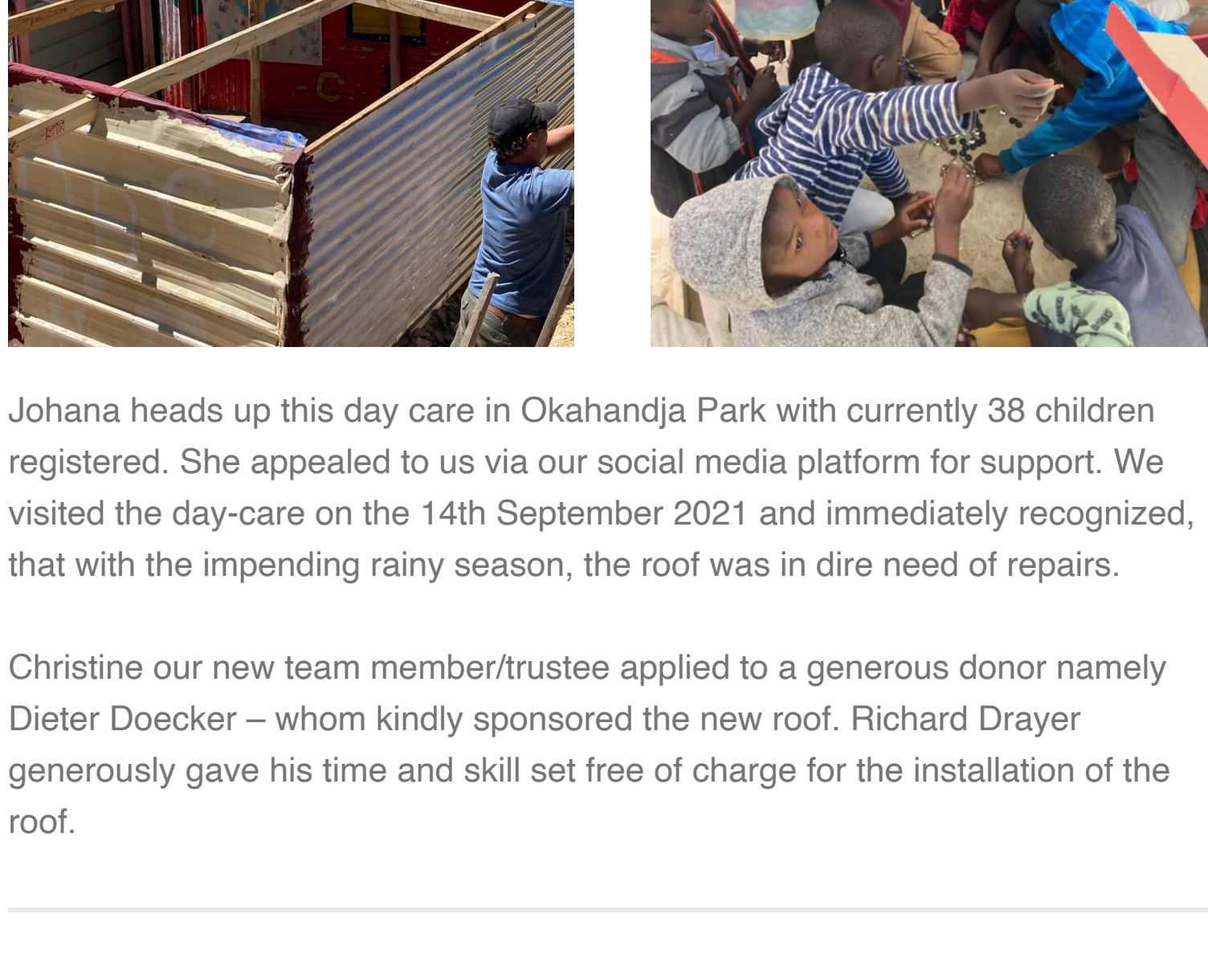

Basics such as these not only help in the immediate circumstances, but also open doors for a better life.

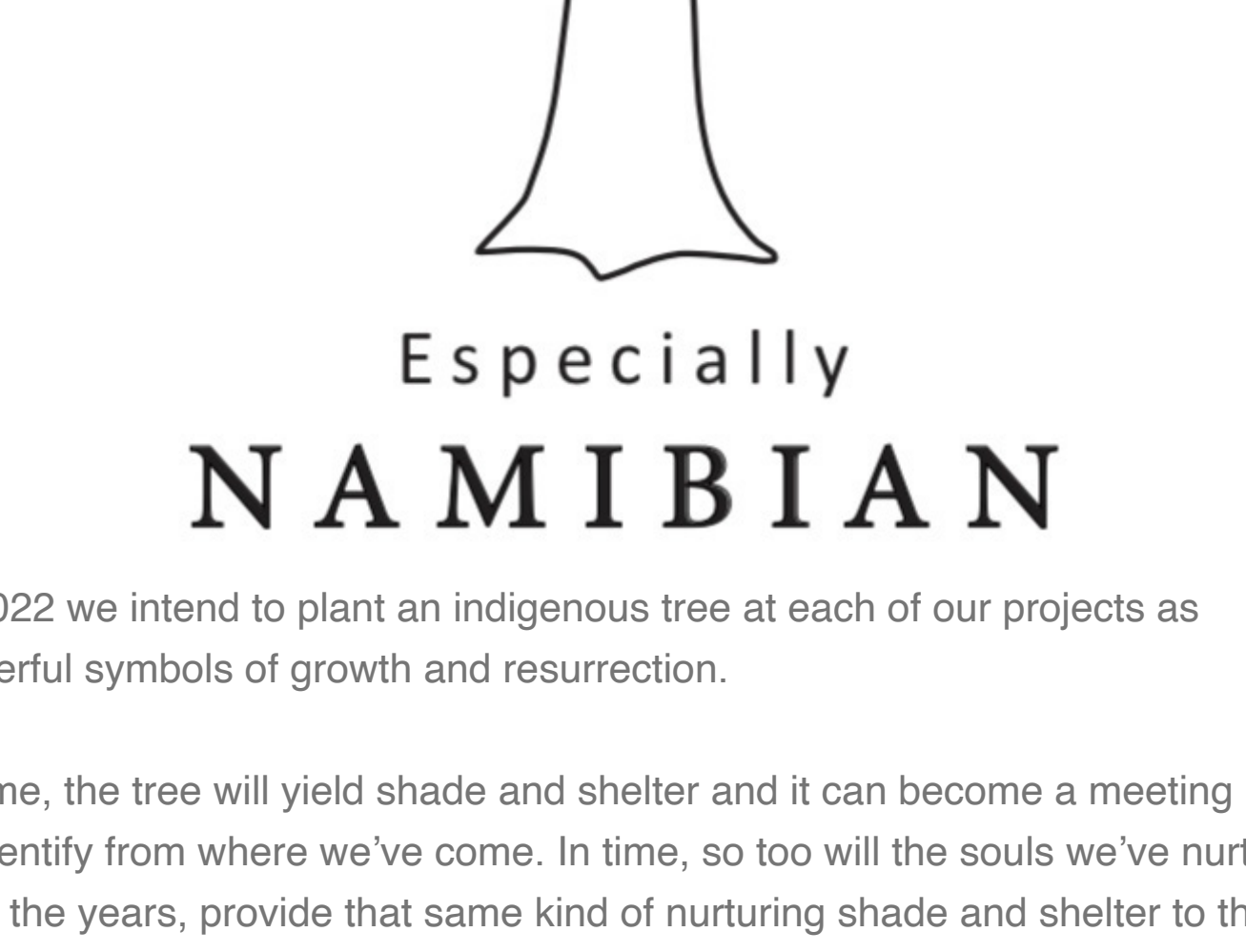
Rose Pre-Primary and Day Care

Newly appointment of Trustee: Christine Drayer



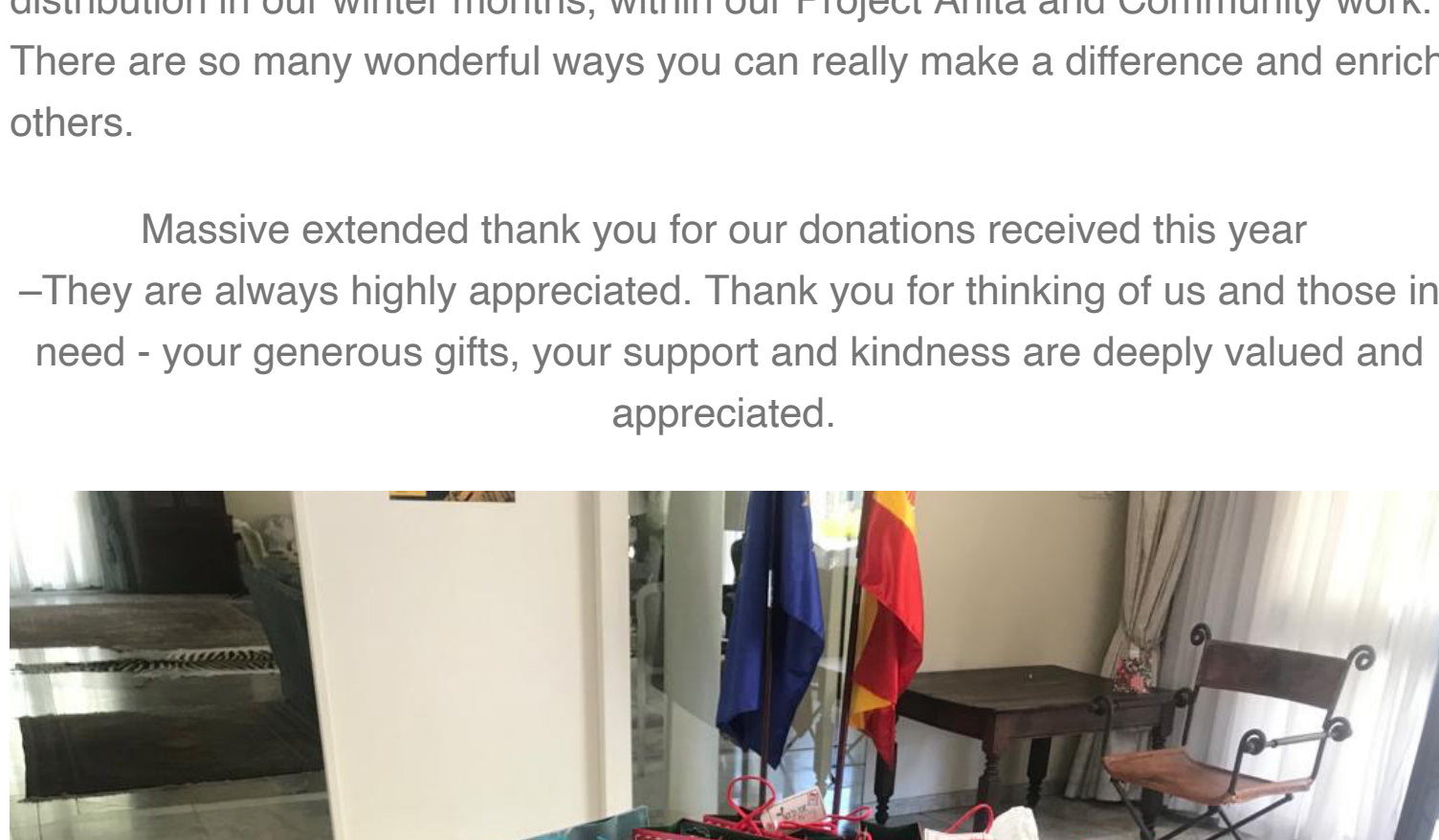
